After sitting in many meetings and hearing, "we need to get our young people involved" the American Council of Snowmobile Associations (ACSA) took action and created a young leader's program. This program is called ACSA future leaders program, broken into two groups:

- Next Gen National Riders (NGNR) which is a group of 21- to 30-year-old young adults that want to help and learn about snowmobiling on all levels; national, state and local.
- Trail Blazers are the younger adults from ages 16 to 20 who will be mentored by members within each state.
